If they (FNL) towed it there then it's fine to have their involvement in getting it back. However, if that's not the case then site staff will need to be the ones to pick up the trailer.


If a truck and hitch are not available, please use enterprise rental via our contract to get a suitable truck and coordinate subsequent trailer pickup and boat retrieval.

We cannot be asking the FNL for support and staff time unless it's an instance of life safety.

Lakeshore towing was just here and they said that they are able to tow the boat to their marina, which is a block away. They will tow the boat over there, drain the water out of it, and get it out of the lake. They will then put the boat on our boat trailer so it can be transported back to our museum.

Lakeshore towing said that the bill will probably be around \$1000, as they charge by the hour. Adam is going to get the trailer in the morning and Lakeshore towing is going to bring their tow boat over here in the morning as well.
